### New tools to deliver sustainable cooling

A warming climate, combined with urbanisation, a growing middle class in developing countries, and an increasing focus on health, comfort and well-being in developed countries will lead to a growing demand for cooling over the coming decades. We are at a crossroads: doing nothing is not an option.

- The EPEE White Paper on Sustainable Cooling provides insights into the broader context of cooling – taking the example of Europe – with a five-step approach on the potential of sustainable cooling to contribute to achieving carbon neutrality, addressing the challenges of Kigali Amendment and Paris Agreement while contributing to several Sustainable Development Goals.
- HFC Outlook is a pragmatic tool to support national decision making about the Kigali Amendment. It has been developed by Gluckman Consulting on behalf of EPEE, and further improved and adapted for Article 5 countries with support from UN Environment.
